Objectives of the project

- *Systematically map the ICT research and innovation landscape across the whole of India and capture emerging trends;
- *Provide critical inputs to enrich and support EU-India *policy dialogue*;
- * Disseminate and promote the EU 7th *ICT program* to inspire an *Indian contribution* to challenges of interest to both European and Indian ICT players by strengthen Indian *participation* in projects.



Consortium
